

Pupil Premium Policy

2014-15

BACKGROUND

The pupil premium is a Government initiative that targets extra money at pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds, which research shows, underachieve compared to their peers. The premium is provided to support these pupils in reaching national standards. Free school meals are used as an indicator for deprivation and a fixed amount of money per pupil, is deployed to schools and must be used to 'narrow the attainment gap' for FSM children.

PROVISION

Maltby Lilly Hall Academy Governing Body will ensure that provision, including teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all children. Our priority for 2014/15 will be focussed on narrowing the attainment gap for those pupils not on track to achieve level 4 at the end of Key Stage 2 in English (reading and writing) and Mathematics.

At Maltby Lilly Hall Academy, our aim is to provide children with opportunities that they may not always have access to.

- We have provided workshops, performances and subsidised visits to places of interest to give children a range of experiences.
- Early support strategies for those who need additional help in reading and writing have also been partially funded through the pupil premium grant.
- Support in helping pupils with their learning both in and out of school will be enhanced through the work of online resources.

TARGETS FOR THE IMPACT OF PPG SPENDING (2014-15)

- Our EYFS maintain above national results.
- Our end of Key Stage 1 results across all subjects, including Reading, Writing and Mathematics will remain above national comparisons.
- Our end of Key Stage 2 results across all subjects, including Reading, Writing and Mathematics will show a significant improvement upon the previous academic year.
- Our Year 1 phonics screening results will improve in 2014-2015.
- For the majority of pupils eligible to receive PPG to make at least good progress in all subjects.
- Pupils will benefit greatly from the provision of a wide range of enrichment activities, with an increased confidence and attitude to learning.
- We hope to see a continued improvement in attendance and improved self-esteem, particularly in our PPG pupils.
