Y3 Visit to the Clifton Park Museum
Monday, 3rd October 2022

As part of our topic on The Stone Age for next half term, Year 3 are planning to visit the Clifton Park Museum, on Monday, 3rd October 2022. During the day, children will take part in two workshops:

Activity 1: Pupils will be greeted by a Stone Age elder who will take them in to the park to discover more about people in the Stone Age. This practical workshop will include learning how Stone Age people would light a fire and hunt for food. The class will be outside for the entire workshop, so warm, waterproof clothing and sensible footwear is essential

Activity 2: A workshop within the museum galleries. Activities included in this workshop include looking at real and replica Stone Age tools, a gallery trail and finding out about foraging.

Children should come to school at the usual time of 8.40am and will return to school before the end of the school day. Normal school uniform should be worn. The children will also require a packed lunch and a drink (*no glass bottles or fizzy drinks please*).

The cost of this visit will be **£10.90** per child. This payment contribution will go towards the cost of the coach and admission into the museum and workshops. Payment can only be made via ParentPay, either online through the ParentPay website or at your local PayPoint. If you wish for your child to take part, please ensure payment is made by **Friday, 23rd September 2022**. Please ensure the school has your up to date contact numbers and any medical information we may require, by completing the online consent through the relevant ParentPay item.

We believe that children learn best from first-hand experience, so school visits are an important part of the school year and make a positive contribution to children's development. Such visits can only take place if parents are willing to contribute towards their cost. We hope that you will be able to offer your support in our endeavour to offer broad educational experiences through visits. Parents are not obliged to contribute but if insufficient voluntary contributions are received then the visit will not be allowed to go ahead. We are really looking forward to our visit.
