ATTENDANCE

In your child's new planner for 2023-24, you may have noticed there is a specific page for attendance (this is on page 134). There is a star for each week of the whole school year. Each time your child achieves 100% attendance on that week, they will receive a gold star sticker. Rewards are given in school for 100% attendance, and these are being added to after October half term with even bigger rewards imminent. If your child does not attend 100% for that week, that star remains blank. Our attendance overall last year was 94.4% which although is an improvement from 2022, we strive to attain the attendance we achieved pre-pandemic of 96%. Please ensure your child attends school regularly to ensure they don't miss out on high quality learning.
