E-Safety Week

Thank you to those parents who attended our e-safety session last week. As well as parents, all the Key stage 1 and 2 children and staff had input from Mr Tim Pinto, a national expert on this area. This was an interesting and revealing day.

One of the most startling aspects of the day for us was a brief survey Tim took of the children's internet usage. We were taken aback by the proportion of our younger children who have phones and tablets - this is more than the national average - as well as by the number of children who are regularly posting on apps such as TikTok (some children had posted hundreds of videos on this app) and using 'WhatsApp' groups regularly to talk to friends.

The rise of mobile devices is inevitable and it is now an intrinsic part of both our every day lives and children's culture. However, I would urge parents to ensure that they are personally familiar with the risks posed by the apps and games their children use and that they know what security and privacy settings their child has applied. There have been numerous instances apps such as of TikTok being used to target and exploit young children and, while we do not wish to scaremonger, it is important that both children and parents understand the risks and put measures in place to control them.
