Safety First

As I am sure you are aware by now, we are putting the safety of parents, carers, staff and children as a top priority. I have been pleased with the positive response we have had to the arrangements put in place so far and we have tweaked areas which we felt needed improving. I hope you have all seen and read our risk assessment and premises tour on the school website, along with the links to government documents to aid you on your child's return to school. I thank those parents who have been prompt in ensuring their children have been dropped off and picked up at the correct staggered times—this is important to avoid mixing class bubbles. We have had some cases of children arriving a little too early for their class—I urge you to please ensure your child only arrives at the allotted time (unless they have siblings who arrive earlier). If your child will be late for their start time, please being them to school at 9.30am.

Information on Covid-19 symptoms and what to do if your child develops these is overleaf. I would also urge parents and carers to see the flyer which is now on the front page of our website entitled '<u>Responding To A Suspected Or</u> <u>Confirmed Case Of Covid-19'.</u>

Please ensure that your child only brings a water bottle, packed lunch (if required) and any essential medication to school. Large rucksacks should not be brought in. I would also like to remind parents that only one adult should bring a child or children to school, this minimises the amount of people on site at any one time.

Fabulous start!

As well as the fabulous attitude your children have shown since returning to school, they have also been working hard. Our focus has been the well being of children on their return alongside the curriculum subjects we cover. The children have adapted to this incredibly well and are producing some amazing work, from space art in year 5 to Stone Age work in year 3, your children continue to impress us all.

Reading Books & Homework

Your child should by now have had their reading books sent home along with their new school planner. Please take care of these, if a planner is lost then a charge of £2 will be administered for a replacement. Homework for your child (KS2) will be distributed via the Purple Mash online platform that was used during lockdown. Your child's teacher will advise when homework will be set. If you have any issues accessing this, please don't hesitate to get in contact with school and we can ensure you receive the homework via alternative means.

Understandably, many parents and carers have been enquiring about whether their child should be sent to school if they have certain symptoms. The guide above should provide you with an idea of whether your child has symptoms relating to Covid-19 or whether they are suffering from another illness. If your child has any of the following symptoms then they should not be sent to school, should self-isolate and get a Covid-19 test.

- A raised temperature or fever
- A continuous dry cough
- Fatigue
- Shortness of breath
- A loss of taste or smell

If your child develops Covid-19 symptoms during the school day, then you will be called to collect them as soon as possible. They will be isolated in school until they are collected and you will be advised to self-isolate and obtain a Covid-19 test.

We currently have had no positive tests for Covid-19 in school, however, should one arise we will inform our local health protection team (part of Public Health England) who will work with us to carry out a rapid risk assessment and identify appropriate next steps. This may involve closing a class 'bubble' at short notice, or sending children home who have been in close contact with the affected child. Parents will be fully informed of any actions taken. Any children who have to self-isolate will be given remote learning opportunities through Purple Mash. More detailed information can be found in the government document '<u>Guidance for households with</u> possible or confirmed coronavirus infection'.
