I would like to begin by expressing how proud we are of our Year 6 children who sat their SATs assessments last week. Their resilience and perseverance during the whole year has been fantastic, but especially last week. They remained motivated and determined to try their best which I am positive will be reflected in their results. Year 6 certainly enjoyed their ice cream treat on Friday afternoon in celebration - well done from all staff at MLHA!

At the beginning of this half term, Year 5 went on their residential trip to Bamburgh. They had a fantastic trip, and the children were a credit to our school. The children coped brilliantly with their first residential and thoroughly enjoyed the activities the Y5 team had planned including boat trips, sand dune walks, cathedral visits and more. Year 6 are next to embark on their residential visit to London. This trip is steeped in cultural capital and allows our children to experience visiting national museums, award-winning West End theatre shows, and they get to see all the famous landmarks London has to offer!

Not only Y6 are lucky enough to visit London this term, our student councillors in Y4-6 have already visited our capital city to attend a tour of Parliament and meet our local MP, Alexander Stafford. Our children prepared and asked excellent questions to our MP and even got to sit and observe a live debate in the House of Commons from the viewing gallery. MLHA Student Council has been a real success story this year with regular meetings and lots of ideas generated, which are beginning to be acted upon to improve school, and they have even made some links within the local community such as with the Food Bank.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Our current attendance from September to May stands at 94.9%, which is unchanged from April. We'd like to continue to remind all parents and carers that good attendance is crucial to your child's development in school and every single day counts.

One day missed is equivalent to 6 hours of key learning. One day a week missed is 234 hours of learning over a school year.

Appointments should try to be made outside of school hours, although we realise this is not always possible. We are finding dentists and non-emergency doctors are offering out of school hours appointments more regularly—we recommend these are taken up wherever possible. We are also finding increasing cases of parental appointments impacting children's learning through children being picked up early from school.
