Reading not only develops our children's fluency and comprehension skills, but also develops their vocabulary, sentence structure for writing and their understanding of how to develop characters and plots. As a school, we celebrate reading in many ways and it was brilliant to award so many children with their bronze badges for consistent reading at home for last half term - they are now wearing them with pride around school. Many of our children are avidly working through their year group's must-read book challenge which we award certificates for when they hit certain benchmarks - I am looking forward to awarding more of these as the term progresses.
